

Accessing textbooks on CD:

7th & 8th Grade History books

CDs should auto open when placed in the CD/DVD ROM drive. If they do not open automatically, double click the [My Computer](#) icon, then find the icon for the [CD/DVD](#) drive. If the CD is recognized by your computer, it should say [Texas and Texans](#) (7th grade) or [American Republic 1877](#) (8th grade). Double click the icon. Then double click the [iseopen](#) icon.

You should see a picture of the cover for the textbook on the right, and an outline on the left. The textbook picture should have a button that says [Contents](#), with arrows on each side. To enter the book, you can click on this button, or you can use the outline on the left to find the particular section you want to go to. If you click on the [Contents](#) button, it will take you to the Table of Contents in the book. Clicking, once, on a section in the Table of Contents, or in the outline on the left will take you to the first page of that section. You can page through the section using the arrow buttons, which will be either at the bottom or top of your screen, depending on how Adobe Reader is set up on your computer.

The book has a search feature, which you can access either from the outline, from the binoculars on the menu at the top of your screen, or using the [Edit](#), then [Search](#) commands from the menu bar. The [binoculars](#), [Find](#) command under the [Edit](#) menu, or [Search Document](#) from the outline will search within the section you are in. The [binoculars with a page behind it](#), [Search](#) command under the [Edit](#) menu, or [Search Full](#) from the outline will search the entire book.

You are not able to edit, copy or print from the history textbooks.

The feature called [Help](#) on the Outline view has an option to look at Adobe navigation buttons to help you move through the document, use this feature to help you navigate the book.

There is also a feature on the Outline view that is called [Page Navigator](#). It will show a grid of all the page numbers in the book and you can click the page to go directly to a particular page in the text.

7th & 8th grade Science

If it auto plays, it will open the CD/DVD ROM drive and show the folders on the CD. If not, double click on the [My Computer](#) icon and double click on the [CD/DVD](#) drive icon.

Double click the Start Here icon to open the textbook. You will see a picture of the cover of the textbook. Click, once, inside the cover to enter the book. You will go directly to the Table of Contents. Clicking, once, on anything in the Table of Contents will take you to the beginning of that section. Paging through the sections and searching the book work the same as for the history textbooks. To get back to the Table of Contents, there is a

Back button at the top of each page. I noticed it hangs up sometimes. If that happens, you can use the [Edit](#) menu, the [Go to](#) and then [Previous Document](#) commands.

You are able to copy and paste from the textbook, as well as print portions of the textbook. The Adobe Reader version you have at home will have different icons for copying and you may have to scroll over the buttons to figure out which ones to use. The usual buttons would be a capital **T** for selecting text and an arrow to change it to graphics. Newer versions of Adobe would have an [I select](#) button for text and a [camera](#) for graphics. Adobe Reader is a free download, you can get the latest version from the internet, www.adobe.com (Download tab, Adobe Reader).

7th & 8th grade Math (including Algebra I)

If it auto plays, it will open the CD/DVD ROM drive and show the folders on the CD. If not, double click on the [My Computer](#) icon and double click on the [CD/DVD](#) drive icon.

You must have an internet connection to access the textbook in the following way. Double Click [Student One Stop](#). This will open a menu page, with a picture of the textbook cover on the right. You can enter the textbook Table of Contents by clicking inside the textbook picture, or by selecting the [Interactive Student Edition](#) command on the left. The first time you open the textbook, it may take a long time, be patient. The Table of Contents is displayed in outline form on the left, with the pages of the textbook on the right. You may be prompted to “[Allow Active-X](#)” on your computer to open the textbook. Clicking on the **X** in the upper right corner will close the textbook and take you back to the main menu.

Another item on the main menu is the [Lesson Tutorial Videos](#). These are organized by chapter, and will include a video tutorial segment for each example found in each section. This is a great tool to review the lesson.

Another way to access the textbook, that is a little faster than the [Student One Stop](#), and does not require an internet connection, is to select the [data](#) folder from the CD/DVD screen (instead of [Student One Stop](#)). Then select the [Student Edition](#) folder, and the [Interactive SE](#) icon to access the textbook. You will not be able to access the [Lesson Tutorial Videos](#) from this view, though.

You are able to copy and paste from the textbook, although some of the math symbols might not “translate” correctly into your Word document. You can print from the textbook, also.
